Title: The Fall **Scripture**: Genesis 3

This week's reading in the 2015/16 reading plan includes: Genesis 19-25 & Matthew 18-24

Ice Breaker: Describe a time when not trusting the instruction of someone you should have trusted hurt you.

- 1. Discuss anything that jumped out at you in your private devotions this week.
- 2. Together, read Gen 3:1-6. In what ways do we see Satan deceiving Eve?
 - 1. How do we see him still doing this today in our culture?
 - 2. In what areas or in what manner do you find your fallen nature tending to "buy the lie" or maybe just go along with what is easier or seems "only a little bit wrong"?
 - 3. Read Gen 2:16-18. Who did God leave <u>responsible</u> to ensure that Eve understood God's command clearly?
 - 1. Who failed first in this scenario?
- 3. Together read verses 7-13. Describe in your own words what happened in the way Adam and Eve saw themselves and God once they sinned.
 - 1. What impact do you notice sin has in your own life?
- 4. Together read verses 14-19. Describe in your own words the curse God put upon the serpent, mankind, and the earth.
 - 1. How is your daily life affected by this curse?
 - 2. Do you see good news in the curse? If so, what is it?
 - 3. What are some ways that you see death coming into the world through sin? Is there other Scripture that speaks about this?
- 5. Together read verses 20-24. In what ways does God graciously provide for Adam and Eve in these verses?
 - 1. What is the significance of the skin coverings?
 - 2. What journey or course did the Lord set mankind upon when he drove them out of the garden? Consider the whole storyline of the bible. Read Romans 5:12-21; Revelation 21:1-7 and 21:22 through 22:5.
 - 3. How do we fit into this story and what are we to do in light of this message from God's word?



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Sermon Idea: "The hope of the atonement triumphs over the tragedy of the Fall."

I. Satan <u>schemes</u> to keep us <u>opposing</u> God. (vv 1-6)

- A. The serpent deceived Eve with lies about God's words. (vv 1-3)
- B. The serpent deceived Eve with lies about God's character. (vv 4-5)
- C. Adam willfully rebelled against God and followed his wife. (vv 6)
- D. We face the same strategies by the devil to disrupt our victory in Christ.

II. God always <u>deals</u> with our <u>sin</u>. (vv 7-13)

- A. Adam and Eve's actions brought them knowledge of good and evil, but with the pain of guilt. (vv 7-8)
- B. The Fall alienated them from God. (vv 9-10)
- C. The Fall caused isolation in their relationship with each other. (vv 11-13)
- D. When God confronts our disobedience He expresses His love.

III. God gives us grace even in our condemnation. (vv 14-19)

- A. The Fall brought devastating consequences. (vv 14, 16-19)
- B. Even as God imposed sin's sentence, His mercy appeared. (v 15)
- C. We are never out of the reach of God's grace.

IV. God provides us the <u>covering</u> for the <u>guilt</u> that we bear. (vv 20-24)

- A. God made a sacrifice from innocent blood to cover Adam and Eve's shame. (v 21)
- B. God banished them from the garden in an act of grace. (vv 22-24)
